A holiday the Samoan way wouldn't be complete without attending a Fiafia Night. Celebrating the beautiful Samoan culture with traditional food and authentic entertainment. Visitors are given an unforgettable taste of the 3000 year old culture through spectacular singing and dancing. Fiafia translates as happy get together, and the performers are very enthusiastic and proud to be able to share their traditional culture with the audience.

The performers wear traditional lava lavas (by the men) and puletasis (women) which echo the vibrant colours of Samoa. Our Fiafia night is held on a Saturday evening and is fun for the whole family.

You're invited to come and watch the food for the traditional Umu be prepared and laid at 5.00 pm out the back of the Tusitala Restaurant. We encourage the guests to ask questions and have a go at preparing the food with the staff & then they learn how to weave their own dinner plate for the evening.

The Umu is lifted up and ready to eat at 7.00 pm over in the Tusitala Restaurant. While enjoying the local delicacies watch the wonderful performers (our staff) perform traditional Samoan dances.
